# THE TWENTY-FOURTH JAPANESE LANGUAGE SPEECH CONTEST IN OTTAWA RULES AND REGULATIONS

303 Paterson Hall, Carleton University

# **QUALIFICATIONS:**

To qualify, applicants must:

- (1) presently be studying Japanese as a foreign language; and
- (2) not have Japanese nationality. (Applicants with dual nationalities, including Japanese, will be accepted.)

# **CATEGORIES:**

#### (1) Beginner Level

Applicants for this level:

- (i) must not have a parent who is a native speaker of Japanese;
- (ii) \*must have studied the Japanese language for less than 130 hours;
- (iii) must not have stayed in Japan for more than a total of three months from the age of six.

#### (2) <u>Intermediate Level</u>

Applicants for this level:

- (i) must not have a parent who is a native speaker of Japanese;
- (ii) \*must have studied the Japanese language for less than 260 hours; and
- (iii) must not have stayed in Japan for more than a total of six months from the age of six.

#### (3) Advanced Level

Applicants for this level:

- (i) must not have a parent who is a native speaker of Japanese;
- (ii) there is no limit on the hours of study; and
- (iii) must not have stayed in Japan for more than a total of three years from the age of six.

If any questions arise regarding contestants' qualifications, the Organizing Committee's decision will be final.

#### SPEECH TITLES AND CONTENT:

- (1) Subjects and titles are the contestants' choice.
- (2) Speeches must be written by the contestants themselves.

\*If the contestants read entirely from their scripts, they will be subject to penalty points.

(3) Performance of any kind (music, storytelling etc.) is not acceptable.

### **LENGTH OF SPEECH:**

- (1) **Beginners 3** minutes; **Intermediate 4** minutes; **Advanced 5** minutes.
- (2) Speeches exceeding the limited time will be subject to penalty points.

# **JUDGES**:

Three judges including language experts.

#### CERTIFICATES AND PRIZES:

- (1) Certificates and prizes will be awarded to the  $1^{st}$ ,  $2^{nd}$  and  $3^{rd}$  places in every category; however, if the number of contestants in a category is fewer than 10, the number of prizes awarded may be subject to change.
- (2) 1<sup>st</sup> place winners of all categories are eligible to participate in the National Speech Contest to be held on Saturday, March 23, 2013 at the University of Manitoba. If the 1<sup>st</sup> place winner chooses not to attend the National Speech Contest, the 2<sup>nd</sup> place winner may compete. There will be no substitution in case of the 2<sup>nd</sup> place winner's absence.
- (3) All contestants will receive prizes for participation.
