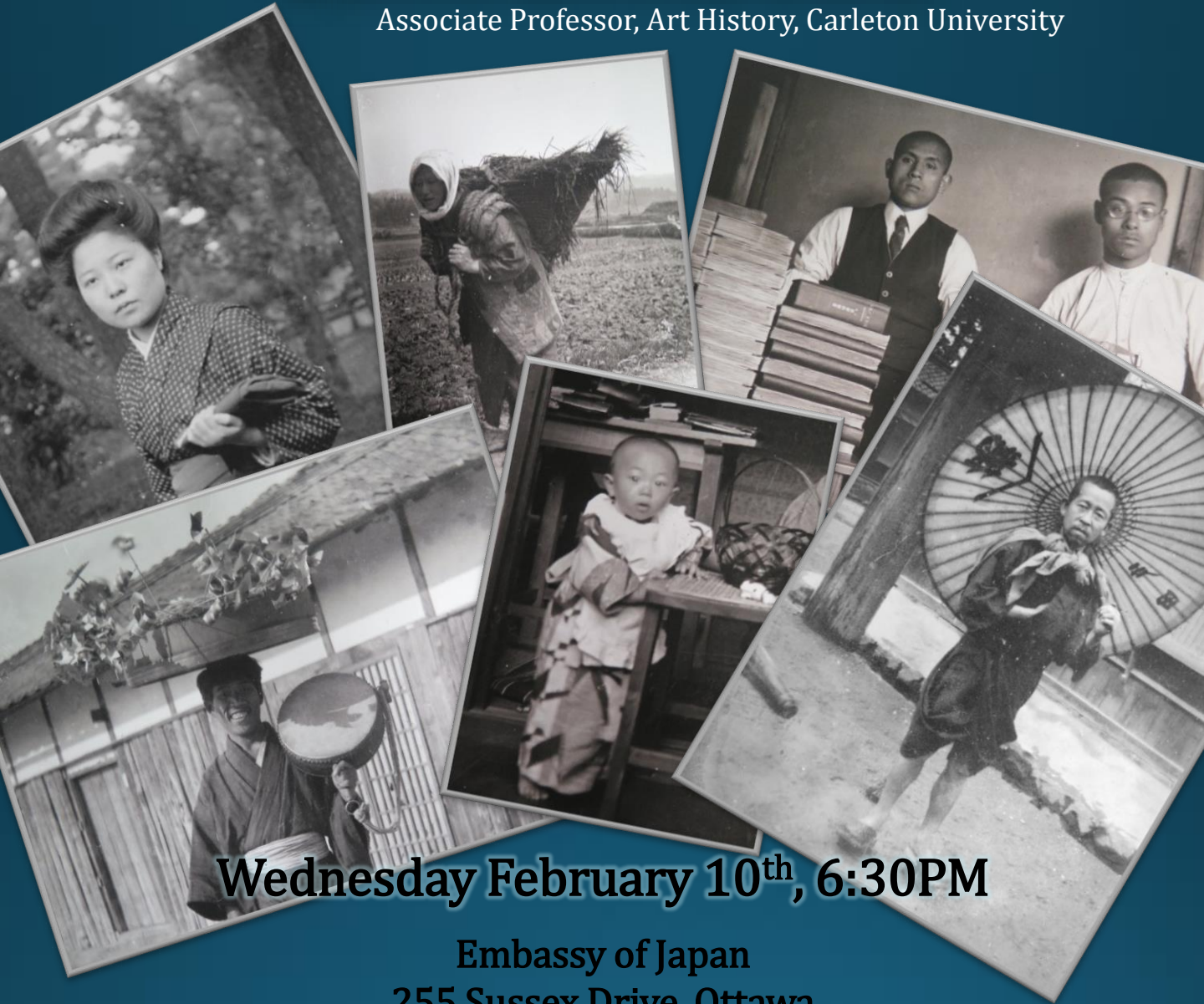


# John Cooper Robinson and Global Photography in the Late Nineteenth Century
